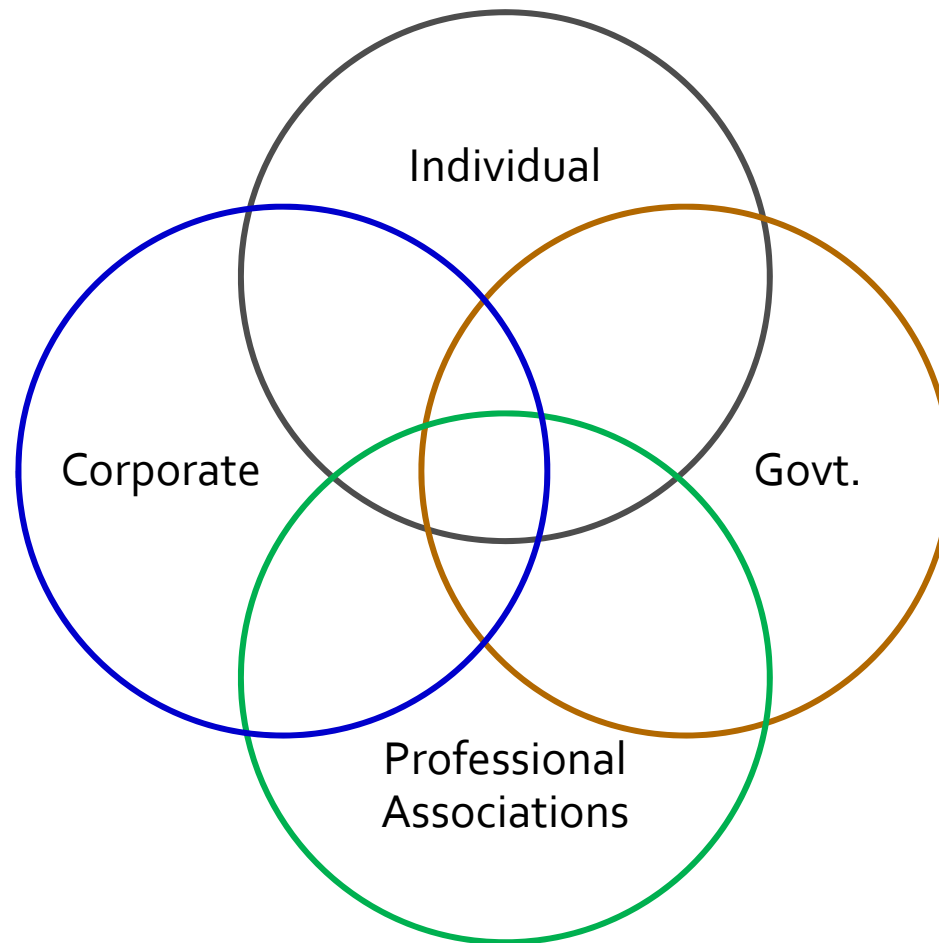
Accountability

Levels of Accountability



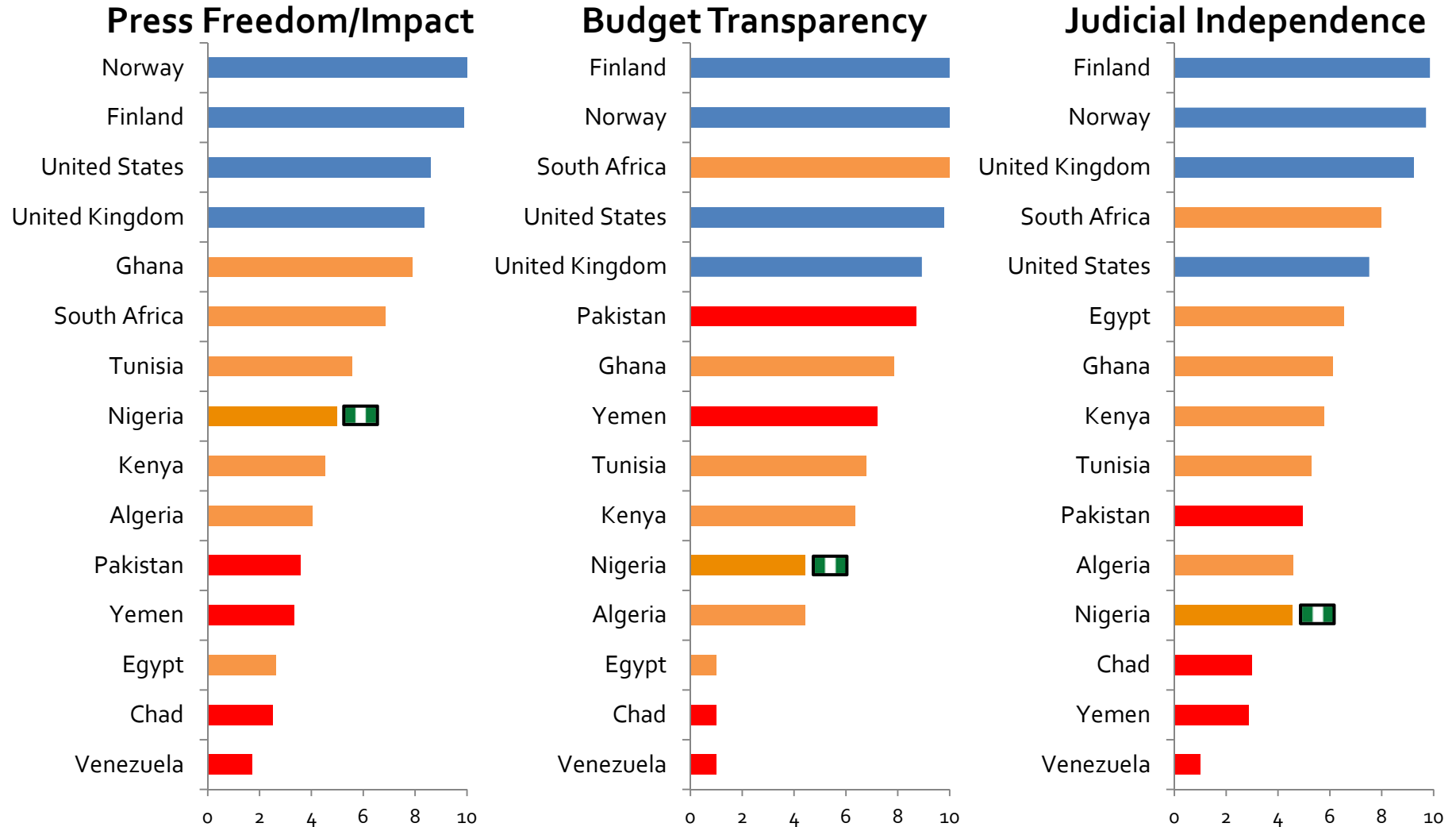
- Accountability occurs at different levels

- *Nigeria lagging behind in key accountability metrics*

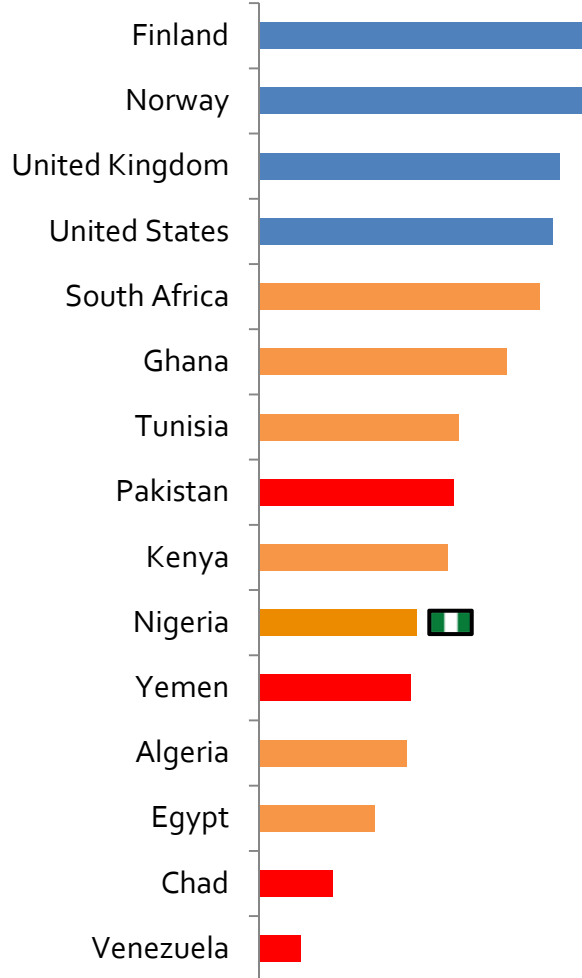

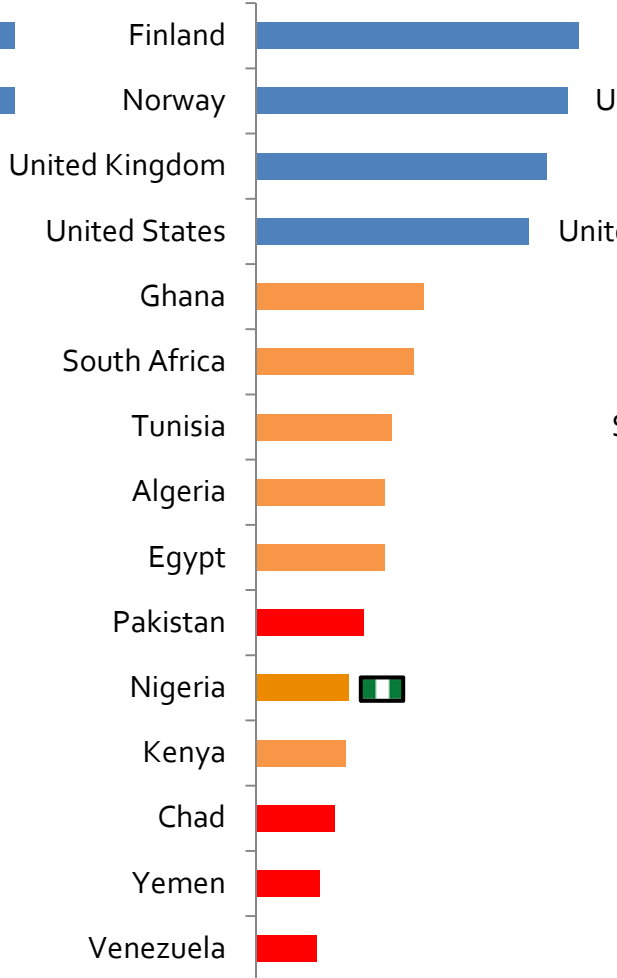

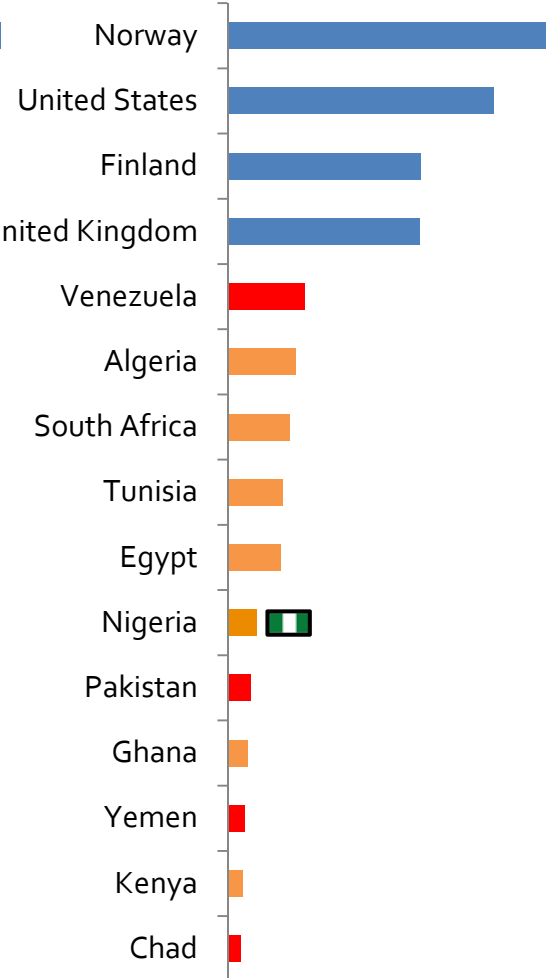
Accountability (Summary)
