EXAMINATION OFFENCES AND DISCIPLINARY MEASURES

1. INTRODUCTION

Disciplinary actions as prescribed by the Council of the Institute will be taken against any candidate found guilty of Examination Malpractice. The identity of such candidate found guilty of Examination Malpractice, his/her offence and disciplinary action(s) meted to him/her will be published in the Institute’s Journal, ICAN News and in Daily Newspapers.

Such disciplinary actions include:

- (i) Cancellation of results of the affected candidate.
- (ii) Cancellation of the result relating to a specific or particular paper only.
- (iii) Suspension of the affected Candidate from the Institute’s examination for some diets.
- (iv) Blacklisting the affected Candidate for life
- (v) De-registration of the affected Candidate as a student.
- (vi) Reporting the affected Candidate to his/her employer.
- (vii) Reporting Candidate to his/her Sponsor
- (viii) Handing over of Candidate to relevant law enforcement agents.
- (ix) Written warning.
- (x) Suspension of Candidate from writing on the answer script for some minutes, during which the candidate may be kept standing for about five minutes.
- (xi) Publishing the identity of the Candidate, the offence committed and disciplinary action(s) in the Institute’s journal, ICAN News and daily newspaper.

2. DETAILS OF OFFENCES AND PENALTIES

*The words examination Malpractice, Misconduct or Offence may be used interchangeably.

(3) Receiving or giving assistance not necessarily relating to the examination without permission.	i. Cancellation of result relating to the particular paper

The Institute's journal, ICAN News and National Newspaper

v. Reporting of the candidate to his or her employer and Sponsor.

(b) Impersonator

- i. Report the impersonator to his/her school, employer, Institute or professional body
- ii. Hand over the impersonator to the Police for prosecution
- iii. Publication of impersonator's name and other details in The Institute's journal, ICAN News and National Newspapers

(c) If the Impersonator is an ICAN Student

- i. Blacklisting and banning the Student from all the Institute's examinations.
- ii. De-registration of the Student i.e. removing the name from the list of Students.
- iii. Cancellation of all the papers previously passed by the student at all levels of the examination.
- iv. Publication of student's name, offence and disciplinary action in The Institute's journal, ICAN News and National Newspaper

v. Reporting of the student to his or her employer and Sponsor.

vi. Handing over of the student to the Police.

(d) If the Impersonator is an ICAN graduate or Member

- i. Report ICAN Graduate to Students' Investigating Committee for Professional Misconduct

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ii. Report ICAN Member to Accountants' Investigating Panel for Professional Misconduct iii. Handing over of the affected Graduate or Member to the Police.
<p>(22) Bringing to the Examination hall dangerous weapons or acting in such a way as to disrupt the examinations.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. Blacklisting and banning the candidate from all the Institute's examinations. ii. De-registration of the candidate i.e. removing the name from the list of Students. iii. Cancellation of all the papers written by the candidate for the particular examination iv. Publication of candidate's name, offence and disciplinary action in The Institute's journal, ICAN News and National Newspaper v. Report the candidate to his or her employer and Sponsor vi. Handover the candidate to the Police for prosecution.
